

1. Hidden Histories at Durley Hill Cemetery

About: Durley Hill Cemetery is a peaceful Victorian burial ground and the location of a major Roman archaeological site. Discover the unusual mortuary chapel, read our information boards, and meet our friendly grounds team. Avon Wildlife Trust will be on hand to show visitors some of the local wildlife, including moths. **Suitable for:** Everyone is welcome. Colouring activities available for families.

Enjoy hourly tours of the former Fry's Factory, led by Geoff Davis, resident, and Eric Miles, former employee. Explore the old Sports Pavilion, now used as the 'Somerdale Shed and Community Garden', and see displays of vintage tools. There will be several self-guided walks taking you around the wider site. **Suitable for:** Everyone is welcome. There is a playground, and benches situated around the longer walks.

About: Stroll the landscaped remains of this significant medieval abbey, founded in 1166. Guided talks will shed light on Heahmund, a warrior bishop, and Jasper Tudor, uncle to Henry VII, both of whom were buried here. The abbey remains are now laid out as gardens using plants which were available in medieval England. **Suitable for:** Everyone is welcome. Guided talk aimed at adults.

About: An exhibition celebrating two fascinating aspects of local history. *Keynsham Through Time* includes displays of artefacts recovered from the medieval Abbey, including three iconic decorative stone bosses, alongside a scale model. Encounter artefacts relating to Keynsham's brass mills, and learn about the people who worked there. **Suitable for:** Everyone is welcome. Come along on Saturday 9 September for special family activities including a Victorian storyteller and historic crafts.

Suitable for: Ages 8+. The route is paved and there are no steps, but there are some steeps sections in the park and on Dapps Hill.

About: Albert Mill dates back to 1700. This is a unique opportunity to wander around this historic building which is now a private residence of 40 apartments. The mill room is a walk-through history with many pieces of original machinery in place. There will be a display of photographs, a historical timeline, people on hand to answer questions, and refreshments in the beautiful gardens.

Suitable for:

Everyone is welcome. There is a quiz for children. This is an old building, with steps and uneven ground.
